Raptor Center

A Visit to the Raptor Center





On a very cold day In March, Barb and I visited the Cascade Raptor Center in Eugene Oregon. We learned about the Center from fellow Capitol Woodcarver, Joe Perez. (see his biography at www.capitolwoodcarv ers.org, under "about us-meet a member")

Joe was carving this very nice owl in Jim Harris' Wednesday morning carving class, so I asked him about his interest in these raptors. He explained that when wildlife organizations rehabilitate owls. they call him and he relocates them to their natural habitat near local vineyards. The vineyards benefit from the rodent management the owls provide. Joe then told me about the Center in Eugene.





The Cascade Raptor Center has one of the largest collections of native raptor species in the Pacific Northwest. The Center is open year round and is a great place to visit, especially if you are interested in bird carving. They have nearly 50 birds of prey in large outdoor aviaries. Their Wildlife Hospital provides high quality medical treatment and rehabilitation to over 250 sick, injured, and orphaned birds each year. When a Raptor is ready, it is released to the wild.

Useful Tips

Useful Tips

Many exotic woods are toxic. Always use a good quality dust mask when using power tools on exotic woods as the dust created can be a threat to one's throat and lungs. Consider gloves and long sleeved shirts to prevent allergic skin reactions.

Found wood and wood that has developed spalting may contain mold or fungus. Use the same precautions.

Always use eye protection when using power tools.

Slivers from oak and western red cedar can rapidly cause an infection at the point of penetration. Remove slivers immediately and thoroughly.

Slivers can sometimes be removed with a good quality tape such as Gorilla Tape. Apply it over the sliver and remove.
