Pick up entries: Tuesday, Sept. 6, 2 pm to 7 pm Wednesday, Sept. 7, 10 am to 2 pm

She reminded us that if a "coordinator" (in lieu of an instructor) came forward, then the time slot could still be held for woodcarving. If the "coordinator" could not be present, a substitute could fill in for that day.

A coordinator would be a non-paid carver who would make sure the room was opened and closed, and who would punch cards. Since it would be an open carving session, without an actual instructor, the charge would be \$3 per carver.

Monday night carving with Denis Miller, and Friday open carving will not change.
