Useful Tips



Keep your burning tips at the ready and always within reach.

This tip is for our pyrography artists. Sometimes wood burning tips are misplaced or they roll off the table. If you have trouble keeping track of your tips use some removable mounting putty or mounting squares to attach a 2 1/2 to 3 inch glass container lid to the top of your wood burner.

The lid makes a great place to keep those burning tips handy.

Fire Painting With Cynthia Longhat-Adams

Cynthia Longhat-Adams, from Depoe Bay, Oregon, is an accomplished Pyrographer, or "Fire Painter". She was the Featured Artist at the 2018, Coastal Carvers, "Artistry in Wood" show in Lincoln City, Oregon.

Fire Painting is a specialized technique utilizing a small torch to create images on paper. The artist paints the surface with milk, which is sometimes tinted with colored ink. A small torch is then used to scorch or burn the surface to create images and shading. Milk has a lower burn temperature than paper so the artist can control the amount of shading desired.
