Carving Tip

If you are uncertain where to place the eyelet for hanging your beautifully painted asymmetrical ornament, try this:

Make a knot in a piece of string, heavy thread, or dental floss. Imbed it in a small ball of mounting putty and stick the ball on the ornament. Dangle the ornament and repeat until you find the best balance point.
