Kathie's family consists of her mother, a brother, a sister, and several nieces and nephews.


Friday Lunches

Status Update, Club Events

Status Report on Regular Club Events

Our Club and our members have a history of being very active but this past year has negatively impacted just about everything we do. Many Club members have been asking the status of events such as our participation in local fairs, Christmas ornament sales, annual picnic and more. We continue to hope to be able to get back to normal soon but changing restrictions and guidance, and venue and schedule uncertainty are having a huge impact on planning and implementation.

Hopefully the following list of events and the status of our participation and involvement will answer some of the questions being asked. We know there is still a lot of uncertainty but we are working to pin down exactly how the Club will be involved in these events.

- Marion County Fair: The Marion County Fair is scheduled for July 9 11, 2021. This is a shortened schedule and not all events will take place. The Club has not been contacted by the Fair regarding their intent of hosting our, or similar, Club booths this year. In previous years we manned a booth for the full week of the Fair but with the shortened schedule and reduced time to plan, it is uncertain whether we will be participating or not.
- **State Fair:** We may participate in the State Fair: Jack Dalton is our liaison with the Fair organizers and he is awaiting further information. Our Club has participated in this Fair for several years and it is a good venue for advertising our Club. As soon as we hear from the Fair management we will let you know the status of our participation.
- Oregon Rendezvous: The Oregon Rendezvous may take place if COVID restrictions are lifted such that Canyon View Camp is able to accommodate this event. This Rendezvous, overseen and organized by Everett Koontz, has always been a great event where Club members and others could meet, share experience, and generally enjoy each other's' company.
- Everett Koontz Studio Monday Morning Carving: This
 carving session is open. Attendees are happy to meet and
 carve. The studio is large enough to allow some
 distancing.

- Club Meetings: Business meetings will resume the last Tuesday of the month as soon as restrictions permit. We have asked the Center50+ to advise us as to when they will reopen to host our monthly business meetings. It will be nice to have these resume.
- August Picnic in the Park: We may have it. We are
 waiting further information. If Center50+ is open, we may
 have a regular meeting instead. We will let members know
 soon whether or not this event will take place.
- Keizer Art Association Gallery Show: We will
 participate in this show if KAA opens. This event was very
 popular with the public and it successfully introduced
 woodcarving to many who were not even aware of the art
 of woodcarving. This show will take place during the
 month of October if it proceeds.
- Polk County Ornament Sale: Probable, but is dependent on the Polk County Fairgrounds opening and the restrictions, if any, put in place by the organizers. Our Club always showed well at this event and it serves as a good fundraiser for the Club. Members who donate ornaments are much appreciated and a big THANK YOU goes out to all of you.
- **Carving Class:** Jim Harris is teaching woodcarving at Center50+ Wednesday mornings 10AM-12PM. Registration is through the Center50+ website.
