REFLECTIONS ON A CLASS TAUGHT BY RON LUNDE AT EVERETT KOONTZ'S HOME, FEBRUARY 15-18-2018

Have you ever looked a piece of Native Indian Art such as a mask, totem or painting and marveled at its beauty but couldn't make sense of it? I know I have.

Pacific Northwest Coastal Indian Art has evolved over hundreds of years. The design elements and principles used today are the result of contributions from many tribes and their cultures. The art often reflects an attempt to understand and portray the natural and spiritual world, utilizing the tools and materials available. A European influence can be seen as trade developed. Now we are seeing contemporary artists straying from the more traditional designs with the addition of more colors, design elements, and interpretations. Scholars have studied artifacts and works to formulate explanations for the design elements and "rules" that guided the more traditional works of the Northwest Coastal artists.

Ron Lunde has studied the traditional art form, and has perfected his skills over several years. He has become not only an award-winning carver/artist, but also an excellent teacher.

I was fortunate to be able to join seven other carvers in a $3-\frac{1}{2}$ day class presented by Ron that was facilitated and hosted by Everett Koontz in his carving workshop.

The class began with an introduction to the evolution of the Northwest Coastal Art style. We then proceeded to carve a trout, utilizing photos, drawings, a "go-by" (from one of Ron's award-winning pieces) and personalized guidance from Ron. Here is where this class became unique. Following a presentation on design elements and principles of form, we laid out and carved our own patterns on the trout. We then moved on to painting, utilizing traditional colors.

I have to say this was one of the best classes I have taken. Ron's multifaceted teaching method made this project much more than carving a duplicate of a "go-by". In the end we all left with a much greater understanding and appreciation of Pacific Northwest Coast Native Art.

Useful Tips

Useful Tips

When working with wood that is either too hard or too soft, to achieve good detail, apply by spaying a 50/50 mix of rubbing alcohol and water to the area. Once the mixture is absorbed into the wood, it cuts much more easily. This also works well for cutting against the grain or cross grain.
