President's Message

A while back, one of our members had a vision to elevate the public perception of woodcarving from "Craft" to "Art". He had the Idea of having a month-long Art Gallery Show. Capitol Woodcarvers had never done this before, so the idea was presented to the Club at a monthly membership meeting, and it was unanimously approved. The Keizer Art Association had never had this type of show, but they were anxious to try it, and they agreed to designate the month of March for the project. Thus, began the challenge of converting a venue primarily used for hanging art, to one capable of displaying three-dimensional artwork as well. Several members put together a plan and solved that problem. Forty members entered 152 art pieces for display. The process of spreading the word about the event via social contacts, as well as digital and printed media, began. On Wednesday afternoon, February 27, Capitol woodcarvers converted the Keizer Art Center Gallery a into a fabulous display of our artistry, for art lovers and students to enjoy for the whole month of March.

I thank everyone in the Club for their help and support of this project, which truly exemplifies our club purpose to; "preserve the art of woodcarving and encourage and stimulate new carvers"

I especially thank Bob Curtis for his "idea" and for being the driving force behind this ambitious endeavor.


April Show Planning Meeting
