Useful Tips

Useful Tips

CARVING EYES

Eyes are not holes! They are mounds and the eye socket is quite large. Take a look at a human skull to see. Lots of carvers do not get the area of the eye nearest the nose deep enough. Try carving eyes on a flat piece of board first until you get the technique down. The eye is same width as the nose. The center of the eye always lines up with the corner of the mouth. Carve a hundred eyes and then carve 100 more and you might be ready to carve an eye in your carving.

These open carving sessions take place at the Center 50+ on the last Saturday of the month. There is a \$3 room rental fee charged by the Center 50+. Come join us.












