Falls City High School Project

Falls City High School Project Update

The Club received this email from Jason Evans, Club member and High School teacher.

"The school year is coming to an end and I wanted to send you an update. Mid-April the students completed their first larger carving, a snowman. The students enjoyed this project, but it took much longer than I was planning (about 15 class sessions). Last week we had a full





five day school week and I presented them with Jenga blocks. I challenged the students to design, carve and paint the project in 5 class days. Most students met the challenge; a few needed a couple additional days. Currently, we are working on a simple Santa carving; many of the students are changing the pattern and are carving wizards instead. The next project is a jam spreader. The final project will be a carving of the student's choice.

This course has been a challenge, but a very rewarding experience. I'm looking forward to see what comes from my students in their final projects. I'll keep you posted on their progress. Thanks, Jason"
