Center 50+ZOOM Woodcarvers Get Together



Full disclosure, I am a huge Lora Irish fan. She is an easy-to-understand teacher and gives excellent directions for the novice wood burner. When her new book Pyrography Style Handbook came out, I was excited to see what she had to offer. I was not disappointed. In this book she explores different artistic

styles of Pyrography utilizing 12 different projects. Each design has four to fourteen pages of detailed instructions with in-progress pictures. She offers many bonus patterns for the adventuresome soul.

I have included pictures of the four projects I've completed, and while I am no Lora Irish, I have actually learned a lot about the styles of "shaded drawing", "pointillism", and "texture painting". I'm looking forward to learning more from the remaining eight tasks. This book would be a great way to get your feet wet in Pyrography (that is, if you can't take a class from our very own Donna Miller or Kaler Howard.)


