GREAT CARVING CLASS



Recently, twelve Capitol Woodcarvers enjoyed a caricature carving class at Everett Koontz's workshop. Our instructor was Eric Owens, a high school science teacher from Boise Idaho.

Eric, a long time carver, started as a Boy Scout leader. For the

past ten years he has been carving and teaching caricatures.

Eric's teaching style utilizes a generic band saw cut out which can be customized by each carver. He uses a lecture/demo format, followed by individualized instruction. He provides design and technique guidance without carving on projects unless requested by the student.

All of us felt the class was time well spent. Hopefully Eric will return for future classes when his high school and vacation schedule permits.

Don and I recently attended a Road Scholar Craft Workshop in the Appalachian foothills of the Ohio River Valley near Ridley, West Virginia. It was held at the Cedar Hills Conference Center, a tranquil multi acre setting. There were a variety of craft programs offered including: Photography, Marquetry/Parquetry, Quilting, Watercolor Painting, Woodcarving, Woodturning, Basketry, and Nature Printing.

Our Woodcarving class was taught by Bob Barris, a native of Ohio and a carver with over 30 years of experience. He is well known for his wildlife carving, and has over 30 years of experience. He is well known for his wildlife carving, and has won several national and international awards.



There were 40 different projects available for the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ day workshop from wildlife carvings to caricatures, relief and in the round, and at all ability levels.

Bob's laid back attitude plus his wealth of valuable knowledge made the days fly by. Having only four people in the class

afforded ample individualized instruction. It was fun to work with many different woods as well as basswood, and to learn different finishing and painting techniques.



After large cafeteria style dinners there were evening programs including Appalachian music, a tour of a local 5 generation distillery, and a grand finale walkthrough of all the different workshops to see the completed projects. Meeting 70 other "campers" from around the nation made this a week we will never forget!

He splits the firewood then rough cuts a spoon with his band saw. He then finishes the spoon by hand using a Foredom and finally with sandpaper. Dave uses a food-safe oil to protect and bring out the beauty of the wood. Dave has sold hundreds of quality crafted spoons at State and County Fairs as well as at the Portland Convention Center.
