Bylaw Updates

Proposed Club Bylaw Updates/Changes

The Capitol Woodcarvers Board met to review the Club's current Bylaws. The following updates were identified and deemed necessary.

- Change Article VI: Section 4 to read: Committees may be formed at the direction of the Executive Board as needed: Committees may include but are not limited to groups such as: Library; Newsletter; Publicity; Annual Show; Hospitality; Nominations; Membership.
- Article VI: Section 7. The Board will meet each month prior to the monthly member meeting.
- Add Article XI: Finances
 - Sec. 1. Deposit of Funds: The treasurer shall deposit all funds of the club in a timely fashion in a bank to be named by the Board.
 - Sec. 2. Checks: All bills shall be timely paid by checks signed by those currently added to the signature card at the bank named by the Board. A \$500.00 spending limit is set for the Treasurer for paying bills or reimbursing consignment sales without the approval of the Board. If over \$500.00, the Treasurer must have the approval of a quorum of the Board. The Treasurer may not write any check that results in an over-draft on the Club Account.
 - Sec. 3. The fiscal year of Capitol Woodcarvers shall extend from January 1 to December 31.
 - Sec. 4. At the beginning of each fiscal year the Board of Directors for the Club shall prepare or cause to be prepared a budget of estimated income and estimated expenditures for the current year, which, having been agreed to by the Board, shall stand as the limit of expenditure for respective purposes, unless otherwise ordered by the action of the Board.

The general membership will be asked to approve these Bylaw modifications at the September 30 Club Meeting.

Everett Carter teaches a two-hour beginner / intermediate woodcarving workshop, every Monday night at 6:30, at the Center 50+. The first visit is free, after which the center charges \$5 for each class.




